

Indian business delegation explores investment opportunities in Cambodia



A business delegation of approximately 12 Indian companies, primarily in the agricultural sector, has explored investment opportunities in Cambodia during an India-Cambodia B2B interaction held in Cambodia.

Chaired by Cambodian Senior Minister Dr. Sok Siphana and Ambassador of India to Cambodia Vanlalvawna Bawitlung, the B2B interaction was organised on June 17 with the support of the Embassy of India to Cambodia, InCham Cambodia, and the Indian Business Chamber in Cambodia (IBCC).

Siphana briefed the Indian business delegation on the historic and transformative journey of Cambodia, as well as the development of business- and investment-friendly policies and initiatives by the Royal Government of Cambodia.

Senior representatives from the Cambodian Ministries of Commerce, Agriculture, Forestry, and Fisheries conveyed their strong support for facilitating Indian businesses in Cambodia.

To provide an institutional mechanism for trade and investment, Cambodia and India have established a joint working group on trade and investment led by the Ministries of Commerce of the two countries.

The India-Cambodia B2B interaction was attended by over 100 business owners and investors, including the members of the Cambodian Oknha Association, the Cambodia Chamber of Commerce, the Cambodia Cashew Federation, the Cambodia Women Entrepreneurs Association, the CEO Master Club, and the Junior Chamber International.

The Indian business delegation also visited a cashew processing enterprise near Phnom Penh, with the coordination of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, and Fisheries. AKP
